IMPORTANT INFORMATION

It is recommended that you fast 8-12 hours prior to testing.

Wellness Panel Tests cannot be separated out.

Males may opt to add the PSA for an additional cost of \$10 (this test may be done independent of the Wellness Panel)

Wellness Panel is for screening purposes only.

It is your responsibility to contact your personal physician with results.

Wellness Panel Test

Complete Blood Count (CBC)

These tests assess general health status and are frequently used to screen for and monitor a variety of disorders, such as anemia.

Includes the following: •Hemoglobin •Hematocrit •Platelet count •Red Blood Cell (RBC) count •White Blood Cell differential count •White Blood Cell (WBC) count

Comprehensive Metabolic Panel (CMP)

These tests assess liver and kidney function, electrolyte balance and blood sugar level. Recommend 8 hours of fasting.

Includes the following: •Glucose •Potassium •Creatinine •Albumin •Carbon Dioxide •Alkaline Phosphatase •Sodium •Chloride •Calcium •Total Protein •Total Bilirubin •Urea Nitrogen •ALT •AST

Thyroid Panel

These tests assess thyroid gland function and help diagnose thyroid disorders.

Includes the following: Ultra-sensitive Thyroid-Stimulating Hormone (TSH) and Free Thyroxine (Free T4)

Lipid Panel

These tests have been shown to be good indicators of whether someone is likely to have a heart attack or stroke caused by blockage of blood vessels (hardening of the arteries). Recommend 12 hours of fasting.

Includes the following: •Total Cholesterol •HDL •Triglycerides •LDL •Cardiac Risk Assessment

Prostate-Specific Antigen (PSA) – males only

Men whose levels are increased may have infection, prostate enlargement or cancer
